The program centers around providing the children with a safe and secure environment where they can develop their skills and gain access to basic educational resources.

The program will initially be focused on providing the children with basic education, literacy and numeracy skills. The teachers and volunteers will provide the children with a

range of activities and learning opportunities. including reading, writing, and mathematics. The children will also be exposed to a range of creative activities, such as music, art, drama, and sports.

The program will also provide the children with the opportunity to
